Yesterday we were delighted to welcome Jeremy Corbyn MP to the Courtyard. In October 2021, a pupil, William, (pictured) wrote to Mr Corbyn, informing him of our school and inviting him in to see for himself.

Mr Corbyn spent time touring the school, sitting in lessons and talking to our pupils and staff. He even had time for a game of table tennis before he left!

As part of his visit, Mr Corbyn took part in a Q&A session with a selection of Courtyard pupils. He was submitted to some hard hitting questions on a range of topics including the unsavoury behaviour in the House of Commons, his work to end the apartheid in South Africa, the impact of education in his life, his most preferred leader of the Labour party, his opinions on the handling of the Covid pandemic AND his understanding of Autism.

Mr Corbyn describes himself as a glass half full character. Positive things can always happen if we believe in them.



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
You spoke, we listened...

Parent Comment:

Ensure that all pupils do not fall under the radar and miss out on vital learning because they are quiet.

We recognise this concern for parents. We as a school are mindful of it as well.

In all subjects, pupil progress is tracked rigorously and teaching staff are challenged to ensure that all pupils are making the maximum amount of progress that they can make.

We look carefully at pupils who are making less progress than expected. We look closely at pupils who are making more progress than expected. We look closely at pupils who have diagnoses of two conditions which could impact on their ability to access their learning.

After half term we will have an additional focus group—the reluctant communicators. We will be considering what additional provisions we can put in place to give them the maximum opportunities to learn and develop. Further information to follow.


