This week, the Courtyard hosted three experienced Special school staff as part of our Challenge Partners Quality Assurance Review.



The review is an excellent opportunity for the school to quality check it's provision in comparison to the expectations set by other schools and the Department of Education.

The Courtyard provision is very unique. We educate a fantastic cohort of individuals who have significant potential to be active and successful members of our community.

I am so proud to say that the reviewers noted this. They were impressed with the quality of the teaching at the school and the impact it was having on the pupil's achievement.

They also noted the granular level in which tailored support is provided to our pupils. Whether it be their individualised timetables, or their unique pastoral support or the resources and strategies which are deployed. Every way in which the Courtyard is working to help YOUR child is having an impact.

However, overwhelmingly, the reviewers were most struck by our pupils. Their maturity to their learning, the positive attitudes towards each other, their enthusiasm for their learning, their hope for the future.

International Women's day- Sanitary Product Donation

Since 2020 The Courtyard has been supporting girls, female identifying and non binary students through our Girls Group. Due to the low number of diagnoses in girls with Autism, the school formed a Girls Group to ensure this minority of students have a safe space within the school. The group meets regularly to have discussions, do crafts of their choice and get to know each other.



The Courtyard have recently received a large delivery of sanitary products through a competition. The Girls Group have made a place in school where the students and staff can access these products for free. However, as we have such a small number of girls and limited storage, the group realized we could not use them all and could not store them all.



During this discussion the Girls Group students highlighted that they wanted to donate the excess products to NHS workers and a women's homeless shelter in Islington! The students will also write letters to accompany their donation. This has been an excellent way for Girls Group to celebrate International Women's Day (8th March 2022) and support other women in their local community.

Friday Weekly: New River Stadium, White Hart Lane, London N22 5QW. Parking available.


