Consolidate the school's student and staff pathways for future achievement. Maintaining a strong focus on staff development of pastoral support via the SCERI programme and PBS programme. Continue to review the school's curriculum to ensure diversity and relevance for our students and staff.
Improve the quality of teaching and learning QoE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All areas of strength and weakness regarding teaching are identified through continuous cycle of informative learning walks and addressed through effective leadership. Staff are supported to deliver high quality lessons that stretch and challenge all students (CPD programme). Action plans are implemented to share best practice, and effective support is implemented to address areas of weakness. Raise the profile of writing in English and across all subject areas. Ensure that support staff are confident and effective when supporting students to learn and maximise their progress.

Ensure that the school's monitoring and pastoral system give accurate information on bullying, and racist and discriminatory incidents, and that all incidents are resolved successfully. Increase school attendance for all groups of learners, especially those that have increased mental health needs.
Improve outcomes for students 6th form	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To provide work experience opportunities (virtual and in person) that take into further consideration the individual needs and interests of the 6th form cohort and also Y11 students. To continue to support students to access relevant and meaningful careers advice from a range of sources, bettering their chances of achieving their potential and individual success. Revision of curriculum offer for reluctant attenders in 6th form who are experiencing increased SEMH needs. To create an Alumni network that supports leavers whilst also informing and impacting on provision for current students.
