THE RAP PROJECT




The RAP Project delivered our parent workshop on Wednesday 14th June 2023.

The Raising Awareness and Prevention (RAP) Project, provides a variety of presentations to pre-teens, teenagers, young adults, teachers & parents to raise awareness about personal safety issues on & offline. Their core belief, since they began speaking to students in 2012, is that young people should be taught the legal definitions of sexual offences; be able to identify peer on peer sexual harassment and peer on peer sexual assault; consent; and exercise an understanding of how online porn & social media are influencing attitudes, expectations, behaviours & body image.

Our students need information like this now more than ever and this campaign can bring issues that our students face to the fore. The workshops delivered by the Rap Project cover personal safety advice while dating, partying, traveling, at music festivals and on university campuses. They address sexting, revenge porn, gender stereotypes, toxic masculinity and more.
