### **Parent Survey Results**

# **Work Experience**







This autumn term The Courtyard has offered 9 different work experience placements to some Y11 students and Sixth formers. It has been a success and this is due to the effort students have put into each task each week and how well students have been supported by our wonderful staff! It's important to say that all employers that we are working with are receiving our Autism Awareness training and becoming Autism Friendly Employers! Our employers are: Dorset County Hospital, Freightliners City Farm, SoapBox, Multiplex, Sir Robert McAlpine, Evokko-Formula 1, The Garden Classroom, WorkDay & The University of Oxford.

These meaningful WE projects are having a very positive impact on our students (i.e. self-esteem, confidence, attendance, motivation towards learning) and also on the employers, as they are realising that autism is really a competitive advantage. Having more Autism Friendly employers benefits both the employer and the young person.

Two examples of this, WorkDay invited two students to deliver a presentation to their entire marketing team based in EMEA on the 14th December. This was a fantastic opportunity for the students to develop confidence, public speaking and presentation skills, and it was also hugely inspirational for their wider marketing team. Another example, our student's contribution to the world of FAIRsharing with Oxford E-Research Centre, University of Oxford.
