- Wednesday 15 March
- Thursday 16 March

The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over teachers' pay, and not because of any issues at our school. At this time, I predict that the Courtyard will be open to all students on each day of the strike action. If this changes, I will be in contact as soon as possible.
